FUTURE IN ENGLISH

- Common ways to express future in English are:
- 1. Present continuous
- 2. Present simple
- 3. Be + going to
- 4. Be + to + infinitive
- 5. Will + infinitive
- 6. Will + be + -ing
- 7. Will + have + past participle(Murphy, 2012)

Present continuous

- We use the present continuous to express future in English.
- *I'm leaving Baghdad to Amman next week*. (I will leave to Amman next week but I am not there now)

Present simple

- Present simple is also used to express future in English.
- *I leave Baghdad to Amman next week*. (I am not leaving at present but I will leave next week, a time in future)

Be + going to

Another form to express future is using (be) + going to.

• I am going to leave Baghdad to Amman next week.



Be + to + infinitive

This is another form to express future.

• I am to leave Baghdad to Amman next week.



Will + infinitive

▶ This is one of the most common ways to express future in English.

• I will leave Baghdad to Amman next week.




Will + be + - ing

- Another form to express future in English is this one as shown in the example below.
- I will be leaving Baghdad to Amman next week.

Will + have + past participle

This form is used to refer to actions that will be completed before a certain time in the future.
Specific

• I will have left Baghdad to Amman by next week.
