Personal Status	51501215	Arabic	100	–	Personal Status Law is an important subject as it relates to the lives of all members of society. The first part regulates the individual's relationship with the family: marriage contracts, ways of dissolution, and the resulting consequences. The second part governs the fate of a person's wealth after death, including rules of wills, inheritance, and how to arrange legal divisions of estates.
Ba'ath Crimes	51501223	Arabic	50	–	This course studies the acts criminalized under the De-Ba'athification Law and the Law No. 32 of 2016 banning the Ba'ath Party and dissolved entities. It analyzes the legal basis for criminalizing membership, promotion, financing, and organization within the banned Ba'ath



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					Party, as well as the material and moral elements of Ba'ath crimes and their impact on national and social security. It also explains the penal policies established for them in current Iraqi legislation.
Commercial Law	51501217	Arabic	100		This course equips students with practical skills in high demand in the market, especially due to the increase in financial and commercial disputes and the need for institutions to recover their financial rights.
Political Systems	51501218	Arabic	50		In political science and law, a political system is the process of making official governmental decisions. It is often compared with the legal system, economic system, cultural system, and other social systems.
Rules of Obligation	51501245	Arabic	100	Complementary	Rules of obligation in law are the legal provisions that define the effects of obligations from their creation until extinction. These rules cover issues such as how obligations are performed (voluntarily or compulsorily), how their performance is protected, as well as the characteristics, transfer, and termination of obligations.

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Principles of Criminal Procedure	51501352	Arabic	100	—\	Criminal procedure law is the set of rules and procedures governing the course of a criminal case, from the occurrence of the crime to the issuance of judgment. It includes how crimes are investigated, attributed to the accused, tried, and adjudicated.
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Pleadings, Evidence & Advocacy I	51501328	Arabic	75	Intro	This course covers the legal and practical procedures for enforcing judicial rulings and enforceable instruments in Iraq, including compulsory execution mechanisms, seizure and sale procedures, rights and duties of parties involved in execution, and legal safeguards related to the enforcement process.
Public International Law	51501347	Arabic	75	Complementary	Students are introduced to the fundamental principles governing relations between states and international organizations, such as sovereignty, treaties, and international responsibility.

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Administrative Judiciary	51501327	Arabic	100	–	Study of decisions issued by administrative courts in disputes between individuals or private entities and public administration. These rulings aim to achieve justice, protect individuals' rights from administrative abuses, and ensure the law is applied equally to all, including the administration itself.
Moot Court	51501333	Arabic	50	–	Virtual courts simulate judicial systems to conduct sessions and cases within the faculty, teaching students how to file lawsuits and follow court procedures across different types of cases.
Research Methodology	51501330	Arabic	50	–	“Research Methodology” is the set of rules and principles that govern the process of scientific research. This subject equips students with the knowledge and tools necessary to conduct reliable and valid academic research.
Pleadings, Evidence & Advocacy II	51501349	Arabic	75	Complementary	This course continues the study of legal and practical procedures for enforcing judicial rulings and enforceable instruments in Iraq, covering compulsory execution, seizure and sale procedures, rights and obligations of the parties, and the legal safeguards for the enforcement process.

Principles of Islamic Jurisprudence	51501438	Arabic	100	–	The study of Islamic jurisprudence involves understanding and applying Sharia rulings related to the actions of Muslims in daily life. It aims to determine legal rulings in various aspects of life, including worship, transactions, personal status, criminal matters, and more.



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Enforcement	51501442	Arabic	50	–	This course covers the legal and practical procedures for enforcing judicial rulings and enforceable instruments in Iraq, including compulsory execution mechanisms, seizure and sale procedures, the rights and duties of the parties, and the legal safeguards related to the enforcement process.
Real Rights I	51501435	Arabic	75	Intro	Study of accessory real rights, including security and possessory mortgages, as well as rights of privilege.
Commercial Papers	51501436	Arabic	100	–	Commercial papers are short-term, unsecured financial instruments issued by companies to cover short-term financial obligations such as salaries and inventory. They include a specific amount of money payable on a fixed date, are tradable in financial markets, and serve as tools for financing companies and facilitating commercial transactions.
Private International Law I	51501434	Arabic	75	Intro	This course provides students with sufficient knowledge of nationality, domicile, and the legal status of foreigners, including mechanisms for granting residency and work permits in Iraq. It also addresses the law governing contractual relations with a foreign element and the jurisdiction of courts to hear such disputes. The course highlights the rights and obligations of parties in cross-border personal relations (e.g., mixed marriages, divorce, custody, maintenance, inheritance, wills, determination of children's nationality, and applicable law in such disputes) as well as commercial relations (e.g., contracts with foreigners). This prepares students to understand and handle disputes with a foreign element by identifying the applicable law and the competent court.



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International Organizations	51501440	Arabic	50	–	International organizations are legal entities composed of multiple states or organizations working together to achieve common goals through international agreements and treaties. Also known as intergovernmental or international institutions, they have a legal personality independent of their member states.
Investigation & Forensic Medicine	51501441	Arabic	50	–	In law faculties, this course refers to the study of forensic medical aspects related to legal cases. It aims to provide law students with an understanding of how forensic medicine is used in criminal and civil investigations, and how medical evidence is applied in legal proceedings.
Real Rights II (Accessory Rights)	51501450	Arabic	75	Complementary	Study of accessory real rights, including security and possessory mortgages, as well as rights of privilege.
Labor & Social Security Law	51501437	Arabic	100	–	Social security law is defined as a set of legal rules by which the state provides a mandatory system to ensure individuals' social protection against legally defined risks. It grants individuals cash or in-kind benefits in exchange for contributions paid by employers and workers.
Private International Law II	51501451	Arabic	75	Complementary	This course equips students with knowledge of nationality, domicile, and the legal status of foreigners, including residency permits and work rights in Iraq. It addresses the law applicable to contractual relations with a foreign element and the jurisdiction of international courts over disputes. The subject is vital for understanding the rights and



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					obligations of parties in cross-border personal matters (mixed marriages, divorce, custody, maintenance, inheritance, wills, determination of nationality) as well as in commercial relations (contracts with foreigners). Students gain the foundation to identify the applicable law and competent court in disputes with a foreign element.

International Humanitarian Law	51501439	Arabic	50	–	International humanitarian law is a set of rules aimed at limiting the effects of armed conflicts. It protects persons not participating in hostilities or who have ceased to participate, and restricts the means and methods of warfare. The law seeks to protect civilians and humanitarian workers, ensure access to humanitarian aid, and safeguard healthcare and essential facilities for civilian survival.
