Uncountable Nouns

DEFINITION

Uncountable nouns are for the things that we cannot count with numbers. They may be the names for abstract ideas or qualities or for physical objects that are too small or too amorphous to be counted.

(liquids, powders, gases, etc.).

Isotes

- Uncountable nouns have no plural forms.
- They are not preceded by a/an.

Number Agreement

- Verbs used with countables are always singular forms. Pronouns used to substitute for uncountable nouns are singular forms.
- Examples:
- Advice is cheap but experience is dear.
- Opportunity knocks but once.
- Virtue is its own reward.
- My furniture is worn out.
 I need to replace it.

Double Duty Words

Many words are either countable or uncountable depending upon how they are used. Very often the meaning of a countable form is quite different from the meaning of uncountable. Here are a few examples:

Countable Nouns

DEFINITION

Countable nouns are for things we can count using numbers. They have a singular and a plural form. The singular form can use the determiner "a" or "an".

Regular plural forms:

a. Spelling

b. Exceptions-add s only

- 1. When ch is pronounced like k.
- 2. When the -o word has to do with music—and some other cases.
- These three -f words only. Some others have two plural forms.

epochs, stomachs pianos, sopranos

Irregular Plural Forms

Irregular plural forms are few. The ones you are likely to need are the following:

foot feet mouse mice woman women ox oxen tooth teeth man men child children

Foreign plural forms

o Foreign plural forms

a. A few nouns of Greek or Latin origin retain their original plurals.

analysis analyses crisis crises phenomenon phenomena basis bases datum data stimulus stimuli

b. Other common nouns from Latin have gained an English plural without losing the original. Both forms are used. The Latin is the more formal.

formula formulae formulas medium media mediums memorandum memoranda memorandums

No special form for plural

- a. Deer, fish, and sheep do not have special forms. We say two deer, three fish, four sheep.
 - **b.** Series and means look and sound like plural forms, but they are also used as singulars: a series of operations; a means of transportation.

Plural-only words

a. Names of some things which are composed of two similar parts are always plural. Some of the most frequently used ones are:

scissors trousers glasses tweezers pants spectacles tongs pajamas binoculars

b. Two very ordinary words which have no singular forms are clothes and people.
