PERSENT TENSES

Present simple tense

Structure : Verb + s/es in third person

- First, we use the Present Simple when something is generally **true**:

Examples : The sun **rises** in the east.

People **need** food.

The sun **isn't** blue.

Present simple tense

- Second, We use it in the first and the zero **conditionals**:

Examples : If it **rains**, I won't come.

If you **heat** water to 100 degrees, it **boils**.

- Third, use is for habits or things that we do regularly. We often use adverbs of frequency in this case:

Examples : She **gets** up at seven o'clock every day.
