

## BEGINNER1. LESSON #3. JE SUIS GRAND

- Je suis grand. Je suis sympathique aussi.
- Oui. Tu es grand. Je suis petite.
- Tu es petite mais tu es belle.
- Merci. Tu es sympathique.

### TRANSLATION

- I'm tall. I'm nice, too.
- Yes. You're tall. I am short.
- You're short but you're pretty.
- Thank you. You are nice.



*Merci* is a word often spoken in French. You'll use it when you're actually thankful, of course but also, by exemple, at the post office. You won't leave the post office without saying *Merci*.

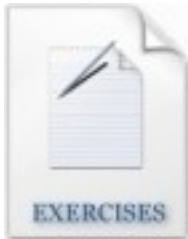


Grand, grande : tall.  
Petit, petite : short, small.  
Beau, belle : pretty, beautiful (for something or someone).  
Sympathique : nice (for something or someone).  
Mais : but.  
Merci : thank you.



Let's talk about adjectives, today. You already know that feminine adjectives are like masculine ones with an –e at the end (français, française). Well, it's not always true. When the adjective already ends with an –e, you won't add another one. There's also a bunch of exceptions like beau (pronounce bo). You'll just have to remember them.

	<b>Masculine adjectives</b>	<b>feminine adjectives</b>
Nice	Sympathique	sympathique
Tall	Grand	grande
Short, small	Petit	petite
Pretty	Beau	belle
