

## Rural Highway classification

Networks comprise

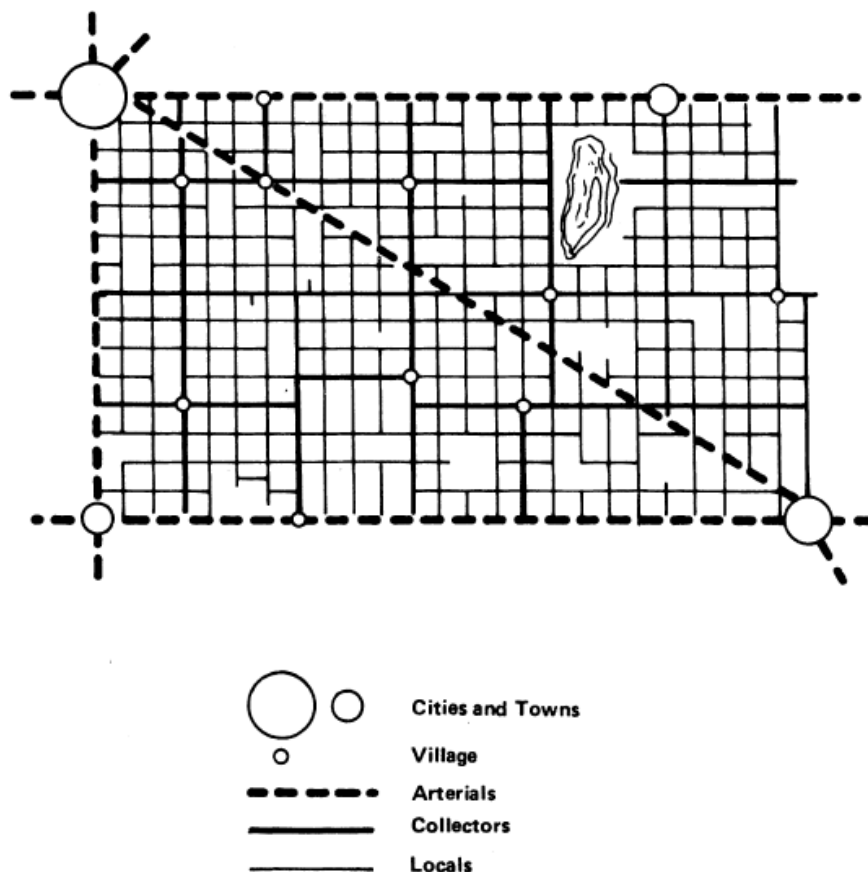
### *Arterial roads*

- Major arterial (serve long distance between cities usually freeway),
- Minor arterial (provide linkages between cities and large towns, including other traffic generators such as major resort areas),

*Collector roads* (serve trips with lengths shorter than those served by arterials at lower speeds than those typically encountered on arterials)

- Major collector (provide linkages to towns not directly served by arterials, linking them also to larger towns or cities or to arterials, both major and minor.
- Minor collector (are spaced at intervals consistent with population densities to provide linkage to higher order roads in the network),

*Local roads* (provide access to individual properties adjacent to the network. Travel on local roads is typically over short distances at relatively low speeds. Local roads are all those not classified as arterials or collectors).



## Urban Highway classification

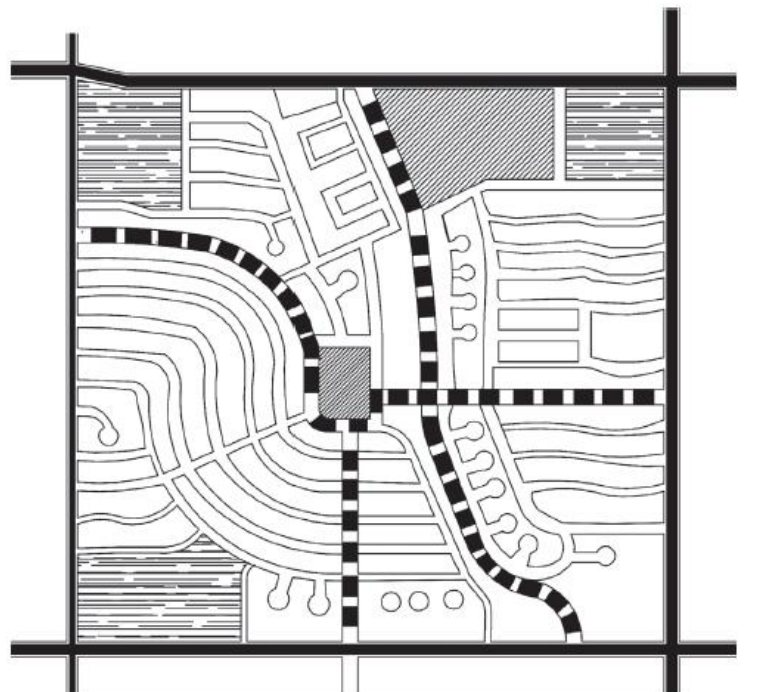
Networks comprise

### *Arterial roads*






- Major arterial (are usually freeways with complete control of access by the use of interchanges),
- Minor arterial roads (provide links to freeway),

*Urban collector roads* (connect between minor arterials and local street),

*Urban local streets* (Local streets include through streets, crescents, culs de sac and dead ends).
