# Topic Introduction - Hopes and Ambitions

- ▶ In this lesson, you will learn how to express hopes, plans, and future intentions using verb patterns and future forms.
- ▶ Key structures:
  - ▶ • want to + verb
  - ▶ • hope to + verb
  - ▶ • enjoy + -ing
  - ▶ • look forward to + -ing
  - ▶ • would like to + verb
- ▶ Example:
  - ▶ I want to travel abroad.
  - ▶ I'm looking forward to meeting new people.

# Grammar Focus - Verb Patterns

- ▶ Verb + to-infinitive → want to go, hope to see, decide to study
- ▶ Verb + -ing → enjoy playing, love swimming, finish reading
- ▶ Verb + preposition + -ing → look forward to meeting, think of going
- ▶ 💡 Remember: after 'to' in 'look forward to', use -ing, not infinitive.

# Grammar Explanation - Future Forms (will / going to)

- ▶ We use 'will' for **spontaneous decisions and predictions**:
  - ▶ → I'll help you with that.
  - ▶ → I think it'll rain tomorrow.
  
- ▶ We use 'going to' for **planned intentions or evidence-based predictions**:
  - ▶ → I'm going to study medicine.
  - ▶ → Look at those clouds! It's going to rain.
