unit 5: SIMPLE PAST

(1) Simple Past expresses a one-time completed past event.

Simple past now

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was an Austrian musician and composer. He lived from 1756 to 1791. He started composing at the age of five and wrote more than 600 pieces of music. He was only 35 years old when he died.

Very often the past simple ends in **-ed** (regular verbs):

- I work in a travel agency now. Before that I worked in a department store.
- They **invited** us to their party, but we **decided** not to go.
- The police stopped me on my way home last night.
- For spelling, see Appendix 6.

Many verbs are **irregular**:

- Mozart wrote more than 600 pieces of music.
- We saw Alice in town a few days ago.
- I went to the cinema three times last week.
- For a list of irregular verbs, see Appendix 1.

Be as Main Verb.

- Ted was the best student in Mr. Bob's class.
- He wasn't a good student in economics.
- Was Ted the best student in Mr. Bob's class? Yes, he was/ No, he wasn't.
- Who was the best student in Mr. Bob's class?

With all Other Verbs

- Ted came here a year ago.
- He didn't know much English then.
- Did he study hard? Yes, he did./ No, he didn't.
- They helped Ted last year.
- Who helped Ted last year?
- What did he study?
